#### **Completing Form TD1SK**

Complete this form **only** if you are an employee working in Saskatchewan or a pensioner residing in Saskatchewan and any of the following apply:

- you have a new employer or payer and you will receive salary, wages, commissions, pensions, Employment Insurance benefits, or any other remuneration;
- you want to change amounts you previously claimed (such as when the number of your eligible dependants has changed);
- you want to increase the amount of tax deducted at source.

Sign and date it and give it to your employer or payer.

If you do not complete a TD1SK form, your new employer or payer will deduct taxes after allowing the basic personal amount only.

# Will you have more than one employer or payer at the same time?

If you have more than one employer or payer at the same time and you have already claimed personal tax credit amounts on another Form TD1SK for 2010, you **cannot claim them again**. If your total income from all sources will be **more** than the personal tax credits you claimed on another Form TD1SK, enter "0" on line 14 on the front page and do not complete lines 2 to 13.

# Why is there a Form TD1SK?

Your employer or payer uses the personal tax credit amounts you claim on Form TD1SK to calculate how much **provincial** tax to deduct from each payment.

If you wish to have more tax deducted, complete the section called "Additional tax to be deducted" on the federal Form TD1.

your total claim amount on line 14. Then your employer or payer will not deduct tax from your earnings.

# Reduction in tax deductions

You can ask to have less tax deducted if on your income tax return you are eligible for deductions or non-refundable tax credits that are not listed on this form (for example, periodic contributions to a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP), child care or employment expenses, and charitable donations). To make this request, complete Form T1213, *Request to Reduce Tax Deductions at Source*, to get a letter of authority from your tax services office. Give the letter of authority to your employer or payer. You do not need a letter of authority if your employer deducts RRSP contributions from your salary.
